When applying for a visa to the USA, Romanian citizens experience an average refusal rate of 2.61%, whereas for Russian citizens, the refusal rate is approximately 38%, which is significantly higher.

3. Key Requirements for the Applicant

To confirm the right to Romanian citizenship, it is necessary to present documents that prove the fact of ancestors' residence in territories that were part of Romania before 1940 or their Romanian nationality during that period. In practice, many applicants do not have such evidence and may not even be aware of their family ties to Romania.

At this stage, our migration law experts get involved. We send official requests to archives and government institutions both in Romania and the CIS countries to obtain or restore the necessary documents, thereby confirming your right to citizenship.

Obtaining Romanian Citizenship for a Chef from Armenia

Armen, 44 years old, a chef from Dilijan, had worked for over 10 years in a small Armenian cuisine restaurant. He dreamed of a better future in Europe for his 15-year-old son and a stable life for himself and his wife. The naturalization process seemed too long, and investment programs were not suitable for him.

During a consultation with a Jurpass specialist, Armen mentioned that his grandmother was born into a family that resided in a territory that was part of Romania until 1940. Our lawyers conducted an archival investigation and restored the lost documents.

After 17 months, Armen and his son received certificates confirming the restoration of their citizenship, followed by Romanian passports at the consulate. His wife applied for residency as a family member of an EU citizen. Today, they live in Croatia, on the Adriatic coast—Armen heads the kitchen in a cozy restaurant, his son studies at a local school, and his wife enjoys the calm European lifestyle.



Relocation of a Software Tester from Sergiyev Posad to Madrid

Alina, 29 years old, a software tester from Sergiyev Posad, had travelled to Spain several times for holidays and gradually realized that this was the place where she wished to build her life. She already had a remote job with international clients and a stable income, so it remained only to find a lawful way to stay in the European Union.

We conducted a detailed inquiry into her family history and identified an important detail — Alina's great-grandfather was born and lived in Bessarabia during the period when this territory formed part of Romania. This meant that Alina had the right to claim Romanian citizenship by repatriation.

Our lawyers retrieved her great-grandfather's birth records from the archives, restored lost documents relating to marriage and a change of surname through government authorities, prepared the dossier, and submitted the application to the Romanian National Agency for Citizenship.

After 16 months, Alina obtained her Romanian passport. With EU citizenship, she moved to Madrid, where she found accommodation and adapted quickly. She now resides permanently in Spain, works with European clients, and notes that her dream has finally become a reality.



Immigration to Italy of a Photographer from Saint Petersburg

Yefim, 35 years old, a professional photographer from Saint Petersburg, worked with fashion magazines and online publications, held personal exhibitions, and collaborated with major brands. One day he received an offer from a well-known Florentine publishing house proposing permanent employment in Italy. He did not want to begin with applying for a residence permit — he needed a stable legal status that would allow him to live and work without restrictions.

During the consultation, Yefim asked whether it was possible to use family connections in Italy to obtain a passport. We explained in detail that this line of descent was not suitable for simplified citizenship acquisition. Yefim then recalled that his grandfather had lived in Romania, and we immediately drew attention to this detail — it opened a real opportunity to obtain Romanian citizenship by descent.

We conducted an in-depth analysis of his family lineage and confirmed his Romanian roots through archival documents, prepared the complete document package, and submitted the application to the Romanian Ministry of Justice. After 20 months, Yefim received his Romanian passport. He relocated to Florence, where he is actively building his career as a photographer.



Obtaining Romanian Citizenship for a Family from Minsk

Vladislav, 40 years old, an anaesthesiologist from Minsk, married and the father of a teenage son, decided to move to the European Union due to political instability in his country. During the consultation, he explained that he was looking for a fast and reliable route to immigrate to the EU for his family. Our lawyers analyzed the family lineage of the spouses and discovered that Vladislav's wife had a great-grandfather who lived in Bukovina during the period when it formed part of Romania. We proposed that Vladislav's wife apply for Romanian citizenship by repatriation so that the family could relocate to the EU.

Our lawyers confirmed the fact of the ancestor's residence, restored missing records of marriage and birth, prepared the document package, and accompanied the submission of the dossier in Bucharest.

As a result, Vladislav's wife obtained Romanian citizenship, and their son acquired it together with her. Vladislav is now undergoing the simplified citizenship procedure based on marriage to a Romanian citizen and already has the right to reside with his family in the EU.



Obtaining Romanian Citizenship for an Architect from Novosibirsk

Marina, 32 years old, an architect from Novosibirsk, had collaborated remotely with European studios for many years. She decided to move to the EU to gain greater access to international projects and participate in them personally. Naturalization appeared to her too long and costly, so Marina contacted us in search of a faster solution.

We conducted a detailed analysis of her family history and identified an important fact — Marina's grandmother was born in the Chernivtsi region, which at that time was part of Romania. This opened the way to Romanian citizenship by repatriation. Our legal team retrieved archival records of her grandmother's birth and marriage, prepared the dossier, and submitted it to the Romanian National Agency for Citizenship.

After 15 months, Marina obtained her Romanian passport and was able to relocate to Vienna, where she immediately found employment at an architectural bureau. She now lives in Austria, develops her career, and notes that without legal support such a pathway would have been nearly impossible.



Relocation to the European Union of an Entrepreneur from Bryansk

Igor, 47 years old, the owner of a small furniture factory from Bryansk, had supplied products to EU countries through intermediaries for many years. As his business grew, Igor realized that it would be more profitable to open a branch directly in Europe. However, he faced a problem — obtaining an entrepreneurial residence permit proved costly and complex, and the path to citizenship required significant time.

Igor approached us to ask whether there was a faster way to obtain a European passport. We conducted a thorough analysis of his family history and discovered that the client's great-grandfather had lived in Chişinău when the city formed part of Romania. This provided grounds for obtaining Romanian citizenship by repatriation.

We retrieved archival records about the great-grandfather in Chişinău, restored lost birth and marriage records, prepared the dossier, and submitted it to the Romanian state authorities.

After 17 months, Igor obtained his Romanian passport and registered a company in Slovakia, where he opened a new production facility. This enabled him to work directly with European partners, minimize expenses, and significantly expand his market.
