Visa on Arrival is an entry permit issued directly at the point of arrival (airport or seaport).

Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA)

ETA ([Electronic Travel Authorization](#)) is a simplified electronic permit for visa-free entry obtained online before travel. It is linked to your passport and required for visiting certain countries with simplified entry procedures.

Obtaining U.S. and Canadian Visas



Lithuanian citizens requiring long-term residence in the United States or Canada must obtain a special visa. Statistics demonstrate that refusal rates for Lithuanian citizens applying for U.S. and Canadian visas do not exceed 9%.

At the same time, Russian citizens face refusals far more frequently. For example, in 2023 the average refusal rate for U.S. and Canadian visas for Russian citizens reached approximately 40%.

This indicates that Lithuanian citizens are subject to significantly fewer consular requirements and checks, whereas Russian applicants encounter additional scrutiny when applying for U.S. and Canadian visas.

Restoration of Lithuanian citizenship by descent constitutes a multi-stage procedure with high requirements regarding the applicant's personal data. The absence of an exhaustive list of required documents results in migration authorities requesting additional certificates and archival extracts, which may prolong the review process for several years.

When making a decision, authorities assess not only the formal compliance of the applicant's dossier with established criteria, but also the applicant's intention to establish a genuine connection with the country. Plans for relocation, knowledge of the language, or active participation in the Lithuanian diaspora are considered significant approval factors.

Lithuanian citizenship indeed grants the full range of rights available to EU citizens; however, the same set of privileges may also be obtained through accelerated EU citizenship programs offered by Bulgaria and Romania. It is possible to become a full-fledged citizen of these European countries within as little as 12 months, whereas obtaining Lithuanian citizenship may take several years.
