Visa on Arrival

Visa on Arrival is an entry permit issued directly at the point of arrival (airport or seaport) upon payment of a fee.

Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA)

ETA ([Electronic Travel Authorization](#)) is a simplified electronic permit for visa-free entry obtained online before travel. It is linked to your passport and is required for visiting certain countries with simplified entry regimes.

Obtaining U.S. and Canadian Visas



For long-term residence or purposes not covered by ESTA/ETA, Spanish citizens are required to obtain visas through U.S. and Canadian consulates. However, the key advantage lies in the level of trust demonstrated by consular authorities.

According to official statistics from the U.S. Department of State, the visa approval rate for Spanish citizens in 2023 was approximately 95%, whereas for citizens of the Russian Federation and most CIS countries this figure, according to various sources, did not exceed 50–70%.

This indicates that Spanish citizens obtain U.S. visas significantly more often and with fewer documentary requirements.

Main Requirements for the Simplified Romanian Citizenship Program

To obtain a Romanian passport, archival evidence confirming the residence of your ancestors in Romanian territories or proof of their Romanian citizenship prior to 1940 is required. It is important to understand that most of our clients initially do not possess these documents and are often unaware of their Romanian roots.

At this stage, the immigration lawyers of Jurpass begin their work. We assume full responsibility for the lawful restoration of your family history by submitting official requests to state archives and authorities in CIS countries and Romania in order to obtain documents confirming your right to citizenship.

02 Preparation and Processing of Documents



Jurpass lawyers prepare your dossier in accordance with Spanish legal requirements. We handle legalization, translation into Spanish, and notarization of all documents.

The final package includes:

- standard application form;
- valid international passport;
- tax identification number (NIE);
- valid residence card (TIE);
- proof of financial solvency;
- birth certificate with apostille and translation;
- certificate of no criminal record;
- color photographs;
- proof of payment of state fees;
- children's birth certificates and/or marriage certificate (if applicable);
- DELE A2 and CCSE certificates, if the applicant is not exempt from examinations.

03 Residence Permit Issuance and Renewal



Jurpass specialists provide full support throughout every stage of legalization in Spain: from accelerated residence permit issuance to address registration and obtaining the TIE card. We also assist with renewing resident status and transitioning to permanent residence.

04 Submission of Citizenship Application



After careful review of the document package, a Jurpass lawyer prepares a power of attorney for your signature. We then prepare and submit the electronic citizenship application on your behalf through the Ministerio de Justicia portal.

05 Monitoring the Procedure and Communication with Authorities



After submission of the application, Jurpass specialists continuously monitor the status of your case. In the event of delays or inquiries from authorities, our lawyers promptly submit official requests and take all necessary measures to protect your interests.

06 Taking the Oath and Receiving the Certificate



Following approval of citizenship, you will receive notification. Within 180 days, you must swear allegiance to the King and the Constitution of Spain before the local Registro Civil. Thereafter, a citizenship registration certificate (Certificación literal de nacimiento con nacionalidad española) is issued, serving as the basis for obtaining the DNI and passport.

07 Issuance of DNI and Spanish Passport



At the final stage, Jurpass lawyers arrange the issuance of your full package of Spanish citizen documents – the national identity card (DNI) and international passport. Our specialists handle appointment scheduling, preparation of applications, and support until the documents are issued.
